SOFT SKILLS – COMPUTER ASSISTED RESEARCH SKILLS

Research " A Systematic scientific enquiry" The Soft skill workshop had started with Re-orient the students on Research methodology. . The basic concepts of research methodology were discussed. The significance of every stage of research right from Identify the Problem, Review the Literature, Development of Hypothesis, Research design, Sampling design, collection of data, Analysis of data, Hypothesis testing, Generalization and interpretation, discussion of findings, Limitations of the study, suggestion for further research and Preparation of the report of the thesis were detailed, A special reference made on Variable, measurement scale variables role in the research.

As the students understanding on research methodology is good and more than the expected level for learning spss, a brief introduction on the development of SPSS software and its different versions were discussed. The usability, scope and future demand of SPSS Skills were detailed.

SPSS software was opened in the respective Students laptops. The basic configuration, outline, design and arrangement of SPSS Data editor data view and variable view were detailed. Students evolved a model research topic with few psychological study variables along with demographical variables for the effective learning and understanding in

SPSS. The variable in the model were entered in the SPSS by the students along with the deliberation on the alternative option available in SPSS on variable name, label, coding, , values, value labels, measurement and rolls. After saving the variables in spss students entered dummy data for all variables in the data editor.

The options available in spss for examinations of data and Data entry errors were detailed, and then students carried out in spss. Similarly The options available in spss for legitimate data modification, transformation were detailed, and then students carried out in spss. The functions of explore, frequency, compute variable, recode in to different and same variable were familiarized. A assignment was given to students on performing these functions and submit the data and output files through mail.

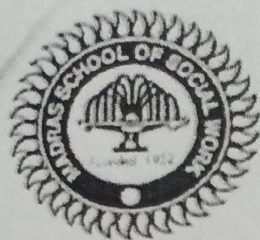
Hypotheses were formulated by the students on the model data and then testing was carried out in spss using appropriate statistic tests. The statistical test that were performed are Descriptive Statistics independent and paired T-tests, bivariate and partial correlation, Reliability tests, ONE WAY ANOVA and post-hoc, ANCOVA,MANOVA, Nonparametric Crosstabs, chi square test analysis and Graphs. While running the test all the important desertion points of output table, interpretation of the results, significance value, reporting and design of the table were

discussed appropriately. Regression and Factor Analysis were demonstrated to build confidence among students on their future use.

With the results the preparation of report in APA style were discussed with APA publication manual sixth edition. The advancement and advantage of Computer operating system and services like on-line and off-line usage, scope and utilities in every stages of research were detailed. On-line data bases Psyc-INFO, Psyc- articles, Psyc-NET, Social Psychology Network were explored.

In the end session the brief recap of the workshop was detailed and the SPSS handy utility functions like import data from other database like xl, saving data on other data base format, exporting the output file on other format (word, power point and html), Editing the chart (changing colour, size 2D to 3D) were embraced.

A assignment was given to students on performing Analysis and output utility functions and submit the data and output files through mail along with a report on learning from SOFT SKILLS work shop
