### B. Background

- a) NALCO Foundation is the standalone CSR arm of NALCO, the navaratna PSU. NF has been successfully implementing the CSR projects since its inception in 2010.
- b) NF is driving its activities centred around the issues pertaining to the common people with the following vision and mission.

### Vision:

To be an agent to engineer holistic development.

### Mission:

To work with communities in the vicinity of NALCO projects as partners for sustainable development;

> To take up sustainable development projects to support education, health, drinking water and basic amenities along with income generation programmes;

To empower women to find a rightful place in Nation building;

> To empower children, differently-abled persons (including physically and mentally challenged), old and destitute persons for a dignified living;

> To promote art, culture, heritage and sports, with emphasis on tribal art and culture, in the vicinity of Nalco projects;

> To promote environmental conservation measures.

- c) NF has contributed towards the socio-economic upliftment with the effective implementation of the programme at the locations in the periphery of the operational area of the company, mostly in Angul District and Damanjodi in Koraput District of Odisha. Subsequently, NALCO Foundation has been implementing various projects in Puri to develop it as an iconic city under the Swachh Iconic Place Programme.
- d) The present study aims to be conducted for assessing impact of the projects with a project cost of more than 1 crore and with an implementation period of minimum three years. In this connection, the projects have been identified and placed at Annexure-A.

### C. Broad Objectives:

To assess the outreach and impact of the projects implemented by NALCO Foundation i. in its operational areas.

To map the outcome of the projects by deploying both quantitative and qualitative ii. 2.0.19 .A.M. JEUNAS ALAG. 2.10 legionista ALAG. 2.10 methods of research.

- To develop an exit-strategy for the projects keeping in view of the aspect of iii. sustainability of each one of them.
- To explore the sustainable models that could add to the existing value of the projects iv. across the thematic areas.

### D. Project Objectives

The four projects were envisaged with respect to the following objectives.

# i. Construction of School toilets under Swachh Vidyalaya Abhiyan (SVA)

- To promote the usage of toilets in schools by the students while complementing to the objective of SVA.
- To ensure improvement in sanitary conditions in the schools where toilets were proposed to be constructed.
- To aware the students on the basics of Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) practices.
- The reference group for this project are the school going chidren, adolescent boys and girls from the schools in the periphery of S&P Complex, Angul and M&R Complex, Damanjodi.
- The major stakeholders for this project are the parents of the students, the concerned school teachers and village committee on water and sanitation in the respective villages.
- While implementing the project, the school management committee, the village development committee etc. were communicated and involved in the process.
- The present study would aim at assessing the existing sanitary conditions while examining the usage of school toilets.

# ii. Sponsoring residential education to poor backward & tribal children from periphery villages of M & R complex, Damanjodi & Pottangi

- To promote the level of awareness among the tribal community with respect to the importance of education in the remote areas.
- To facilitate the access to quality residential education facility among the tribal community in the periphery of M&R Complex, Damanjodi and Pottangi.
- The reference group for this project are the school going children from the tribal community from M&R Complex, Damanjodi and Pottangi.
- The local tribal community, distinguished partner institutes implementing the project are the key stake holders of this project.

- While implementing the project, the school management committee, the village development committee etc. were communicated and involved in the process.
- The identification of students for this project was conducted with the cooperation of the educational institutions partnering with NALCO Foundation.
- The present study will be conducted with an objective to map the social mobility of the community/households represented by the students under the project.

# iii. Operation of Medical Health Unit (MHU) at peripheral villages of M&R complex, Pottangi, S&P complex, Utkal E Coal Block

- To enable doorstep health services through Mobile Health Units (MHUs) in the remote tribal areas of the periphery villages of M&R Complex, Damanjodi and Pottangi mines area, villages in the periphery of S&P Complex, Angul and Utkal E Coal Bolck
- To spread awareness on preventive health care among the communities through Information, Education and Communication (IEC) and Behavioural Change Communication (BCC).
- Elderly patients, women, infant and the poorest of the poor community are getting benefitted. During FY 2017-18, 1.38 Lakh patients have been treated. Keeping in view of similar operations by Govt. MHUs from the provision such as the Mineral Development fund, it is ensured that convergence mechanism is followed in order to cover the maximum villages in the area.
- The major stakeholders of this project are the implementing partners like
   M/s Wockhardt Foundation and M/s HelpAge India.
- The community mobiliser along with grassroot level workers like the MHU van coordinator ensure the smooth implementation of the project.

#### iv. NALCO Ki Ladli

- NALCO KI LADLI is one of the major flagships programme with the prime objective to encourage the girl students from the secondary schools in the periphery villages.
- The selected girl students under the scheme are from the BPL Category with a bright academic career.
- The teachers and parents of the girl students from the periphery schools are the important stakeholders of this programme.

 The selection for this project is conducted through the joint participation of school authorities and the NF team.

# E. Scope of Work

- i. Assessment of the effects/impact of CSR projects of Nalco Foundation on the quality of life of people (security and aspirational framework) & community, on their socio-economic condition. Comparative analysis of the post intervention effect in relation to the pre-intervention situation and findings. The secondary sources are to be explored by the party for such assessment.
- Detail documentation of the projects understudy and study them from the perspective of all the stakeholders and partners.
- iii. Study of the sustainability of projects under study.
- iv. Agency should do a preliminary visit to 2-3 sample sites to understand in details about the intervention. Thereafter, agency to plan sampling methodology, questionnaires for field interviews and logistics (translator etc.), Focused Group Discussions and case study documentation.
- v. Pilot testing of questionnaire to be conducted with respondents and on the basis of the feedback changes to be incorporated accordingly in the study tools.
- vi. The sampling methodology to take care of neutralizing external factors (if any) so as to ensure that the results are the most accurate representation of the field situation.
- vii. Both the qualitative survey tools and quantitative survey modules to be taken up as per plans and conducted in a structured way and triangulations are to be carried out to reduce bias and incorrect information as far as possible.
- viii. Findings corresponding suggestions and recommendations for further improvement are to be a part of the study and study report.
